TOWN OF YORKVILLE RACINE COUNTY, WISCONSIN

A RESOLUTION PROHIBITING THE DISPOSAL OF CERTAIN TIRES AT THE TOWN OF YORKVILLE'S WASTE AND RECYCLING COLLECTION SITE, 19040 SPRING STREET (CTH C)

THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF YORKVILLE, RACINE COUNTY, WISCONSIN, RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the Town of Yorkville operates a waste and recycling collection site located at 19040 Spring Street (CTH C), and

WHEREAS, this waste and recycling collection site may be used by Town residents for the disposal of residential waste and recyclables, and

WHEREAS, this waste and recycling collection site may not be used for the disposal of waste or recyclables by any commercial use or by anyone that is not a resident of the Town, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Yorkville permits Town residents to dispose of up to four tires per month at this waste and recycling collection site, and

WHEREAS, this waste and recycling collection site has in the past received tires from Town residents of a commercial nature, including tires used on vehicles or equipment intended for agricultural, transportation or construction uses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Yorkville Town Board hereby prohibits the disposal of commercial tires at the Town of Yorkville's waste and recycling collection site, 19040 Spring Street (CTH C), and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this prohibition shall also apply to any tires coming from vehicles or equipment intended for agricultural, transportation or construction uses, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk-Treasurer is hereby directed to post this resolution in three places within thirty days of its adoption, as required by Wisconsin Statutes Section 60.80(1), and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution takes effect the day following its posting.

This Resolution was adopted by the Yorkville Town Board on June 12, 2017.
