MINUTES

VILLAGE OF YORKVILLE SEWER AND WATER COMMISSION COMMUNITY ROOM (1ST FLOOR) UNION GROVE MUNICIPAL CENTER TUESDAY, MAY 19, 2020

Call to Order

Sewer and Water Commission President Douglas Nelson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Roll Call

The following Sewer and Water Commission members were present: Douglas Nelson, Steve Nelson, Daniel Maurice, Leo DeBrabander and Aaron Alby. Also present were Sewer Utility District and Water Utility District Manager Gary Hanson, Engineer Mark Madsen and Administrator/Clerk Michael McKinney.

Approval of Sewer Utility District Financial Reports

Motion (Maurice, Alby) to approve the April Sewer Utility District financial reports as presented, Motion Carried (MC).

Approval of Water Utility District Financial Reports

Motion (S. Nelson, DeBrabander) to approve the April Water Utility District financial reports as presented, MC.

Approval of Sewer Utility District Invoices

Motion (Alby, Maurice) to approve Sewer Utility District invoices as presented in the amount of \$137,985.04, MC.

Approval of Water Utility District Invoices

Motion (Alby, S. Nelson) to approve Water Utility District invoices as presented in the amount of \$70,277.69, MC.

New and Unfinished Business - Discussion and possible action on the following:

Water Utility District property purchase

Motion (S. Nelson, Maurice) to authorize the Village's attorney and water utility district manager to begin negotiations with Racine County for the purchase of a portion of the parcel located immediately to the northwest of the existing water tower site, MC.

Sewer Utility District property purchase

Motion (S. Nelson, DeBrabander) to authorize the Village's attorney and sewer utility district manager to begin negotiations with Racine County for the purchase of a portion of the parcel located immediately to the north of the existing wastewater treatment facility site, MC.

Sewer Utility District facility planning update

Hanson stated that he will participate in a conference call next week with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission regarding this planning process.

No formal action was taken by the Commission on this agenda item.

Water Utility District facility planning update

Hanson stated that the utility's proposed second well will have a 400-gallon per minute capacity, will not be a backup to the utility's current well, and will not be a high-capacity well.

No formal action was taken by the Commission on this agenda item.

Lee Mechanical 2020 plant maintenance proposal

Motion (S. Nelson, Alby) to approve the 2020 plant maintenance proposal submitted by Lee Mechanical, MC.

Sewer Resolution 2020-01 Adopting the findings of the 2019 Yorkville Sewer Utility District's Compliance Maintenance Annual Report

Hanson provided a summary of this report to the Commission. He noted that no deficiencies were identified within this report.

Motion (S. Nelson, Alby) to adopt Sewer Resolution 2020-01 as presented, MC.

Reports

Sewer Utility District Manager's Report - Hanson reported to the Commission on the following:

- That the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is currently reviewing the utility's discharge permit renewal application
- That he purchased bulk chemicals for phosphorus treatment
- That the utility failed a whole effluent toxicity test and will need to submit two additional test samples in June and July
- That Reesman's Excavating & Grading installed a sampling manhole on the property located at 1333 Grandview Parkway
- That several sampling manholes were replaced on the property located at 14015 Grandview Parkway
- That he will be working with Aqua-Aerobic Systems for automation of upgrades to the wastewater treatment plant

- That he would like to include an addition to the utility's storage building as part of the utility's proposed wastewater treatment plant expansion
- That L.W. Allen installed the final two lift station impellers
- That the wastewater treatment plant has been experiencing issues with rubber gloves being discharged into the sewer system
- That he purchased a new computer for the utility
- That there are issues with manholes and gate valves being damaged due to the Washington Avenue (STH 20) reconstruction project

Water Utility District Manager's Report - Hanson reported to the Commission on the following:

- That water tower repairs have been completed and the portable water tanks removed from the water tower site
- That the water tower has been cleaned and inspected, adding that the tower may be due for repainting in six years
- That this year's meter testing has been completed
- That the utility's well pump will be due for reconditioning in two to three years
- That the utility may be eligible for low-interest loans or grants to fund utility improvements
- That two gate valves were recently damaged due to the Washington Avenue (STH 20) reconstruction project
- That a water meter was installed for the new facility located at 14015 Grandview Parkway

Engineer's Report - Madsen reported to the Commission on the following:

- That his staff are performing utility locates as part of the Washington Avenue (STH 20) reconstruction project
- That this year's commercial sewer manhole sampling program will begin soon
- That he is working on a sewer utility connection charge for a new commercial development at the south end of Grandview Business Park
- That one of the new sampling manholes on the property located at 14015 Grandview Parkway was buried

Administrator/Clerk's Report - McKinney stated that he had no information to report to the Commission.

Other - Comments, questions and suggestions
