#### **Call to Order**

Sewer and Water Commission President Douglas Nelson called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

#### **Roll Call**

Also present were Walt Lautner representing Lansing Companies, Sewer Utility District and Water Utility District Manager Gary Hanson, Engineer Mark Madsen and Administrator/Clerk Michael McKinney.

New and Unfinished Business - Discussion and possible action on the following:

## 3400 South Sylvania Avenue and 14017 Durand Avenue (STH 11) sewer extension request

Discussion focused on the potential cost of extending and maintaining sewer service from the utility district to these properties, the proposed uses of these properties, the proposed wastewater flows and loadings coming from these uses, and the impact that extending sewer service to these properties would have on the recently amended sewer service area boundary and on the existing wastewater treatment facility's treatment capacity. Discussion also focused on proposals to establish a small wastewater treatment facility on-site, to establish a separate utility-run wastewater treatment facility nearby and to use holding tanks to collect wastewater. The Commission recommended that a meeting be held with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to discuss this topic further.

No formal action was taken by the Commission on this agenda item.

#### Reports

**Sewer Utility District Manager's Report -** Hanson reported to the Commission on the following:

- That he, D. Nelson, Madsen and McKinney met with Racine County representatives last week to discuss the timeline for proposed upgrades to the wastewater treatment facility
- That the utility's review of the design plans for proposed upgrades to the wastewater treatment facility are almost complete
- That the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources is reviewing the utility's facilities plan document
- That the Southeastern Wisconsin Regional Planning Commission and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources approved the utility's sewer service area amendment
- That he was contacted by a commercial property owner outside of the utility district's boundaries that inquired about having water and sewer service extended to their facility
- That the purchase of the parcel adjacent to the wastewater treatment facility from Racine County is complete
- That the utility has access to \$500.00 in grant funds for the purchase of safety equipment
- That bulk chemicals for phosphorus treatment have been delivered
- That another round of whole effluent toxicity test samples will be submitted in January

Water Utility District Manager's Report - Hanson reported to the Commission on the following:

- That he will begin reading water meters tomorrow
- That he will flush hydrants this weekend
- That additional flushing of the water system has been completed for the new commercial development at the south end of Grandview Business Park
- That the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources issued a notice of noncompliance to the utility
- That he continues to work with Racine County on the proposed purchase of a portion of the parcel located immediately to the northwest of the existing water tower site

**Engineer's Report -** Madsen stated that he had no information to report to the Commission.

**Administrator/Clerk's Report -** McKinney stated that quarterly sewer and water utility bills will be mailed at the end of the month.
