VILLAGE OF YORKVILLE
RACINE COUNTY, WISCONSIN

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A FOUR-WAY TRAFFIC
STOP AT THE INTERSECTION OF 58TH ROAD AND 59TH DRIVE

THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF YORKVILLE, RACINE COUNTY,
WISCONSIN, RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Yorkville, in response to concerns regarding safety at the intersection of 58th Road and 59th Drive, directed the Village Administrator/Clerk to draft a resolution in support of replacing the two-way traffic stop at this intersection with a four-way traffic stop; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 61.34 provides that the powers of a village board include the “management and control of the village property, finances, highways, streets, navigable waters, and the public service, and shall have power to act for the government and good order of the village, for its commercial benefit and for the health, safety, welfare and convenience of the public.”; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 61.36 provides that a village board may, without limitation due to enumeration, “lay out, open, change, widen or extend roads, streets, alleys, sanitary and storm sewers, water mains, parks and other public grounds, and improve, repair or discontinue the same or any part thereof...”; and

WHEREAS, Wis. Stat. § 349.065 provides that local authorities “shall place and maintain traffic control devices upon highways under their jurisdiction to regulate, warn, guide or inform traffic.”

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the existing two-way traffic stop at the intersection of 58th Road and 59th Drive be replaced with a four-way traffic stop; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Village Administrator/Clerk is hereby directed to contact the Racine County Public Works Department to schedule the placement of the appropriate traffic control signage to implement this change.

This Resolution was adopted by the Yorkville Village Board on September 12, 2022.
